Important Contribution from EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Towards the Diagnosis and Treatment of Cancer



Known as the most important pathology congress of Turkey, the 27th National

Pathology Congress took place in Antalya with the participation of the

leading pathologists worldwide. Eastern Mediterranean University was represented at the said event by Assist. Prof. Dr. M. Hasan Toper.

The congress hosted presentations on the findings of recent research on the genetic qualities of various types of cancers. It was stated that positive changes are taking place in the treatment of lung, breast and colon cancers, thanks to the new medicine targeting genetic mutations in the said cancer types.

EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty academic staff member Assist. Prof. Dr. M. Hasan Toper delivered a presentation titled "Specification of Double Expressor Group and Its Prognostic Significance in Diffuse Large B-cell Lymphoma Cases"

and poster presentations titled "A Few Atypical Cells that may be Missed in Liver Needle Biopsy: Diagnosis?" and "Suspicious Infiltration around the Lymph Node in Lung Adenocarcinoma Cases: Could it be Malignant Mesothelioma?' Assist. Prof. Dr. Toper carried out research on 'Diffuse Large B-cell Lymphoma Cases" in adults and tried to define genetic mutations preventing the patients from responding to the treatment positively. The newly defined sub-group lymphoma defined in Assist. Prof. Dr. Toper's research findings will contribute to the treatment planning of the said cancer type. It is hoped that in the light of research findings of Assist. Prof. Dr. M. Hasan Toper, new treatment options for cancer will be introduced.

Communication, Turkish as a Language of Instruction, Language Policies and the Use of Turkish, Globalisation, Turkic World and Turkish, Turkish as a Language of Translation, the Relationship of Turkish with Other Languages'. In the said event, EMU Education Faculty academic staff member Assist. Prof. Dr. Ertuğrul Aydın delivered a presentation titled "Globalisation, Interculturalism and Turkish".

Touching upon the issues of 'Globalisation, Interculturalism, Global Education and Turkish' in his presentation, Assist. Prof. Dr. Ertuğrul Aydın stated that "Intercultural harmonisation or integration which is brought by globalisation has yielded positive outcomes in terms of education, labor and work ethics. At this point, the importance of Turkish as the mother tongue (primary language), and as a secondary language in other countries surfaces. The collaborations/relations/ tendencies of the Turkish population in foreign countries including Belgium, Germany and Netherlands have gained importance in this respect. Starting with the candidacy of Turkey for the European Union membersip in 2005,



Turkish has appeared amongst the official languages of the EU. Around 5,5-6 million Turks living within the boundaries of the European Union speak Turkish. In today's world, Paris, London, Brussels, Berlin and Amsterdam have taken their places among the most cosmopolitan and multicultural cities of Europe. In these cities and also in the other important points of Europe, intercultural education should be highlighted as a point of interest both regarding labor and education sectors. Finally, instructional programs should enhance intercultural cooperation and the acceptance of all other cultures."

EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Releases 1 December World AIDS Day Statement



The Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty released a statement regarding 1 December World AIDS Day. The statement released by Dean Prof. Dr. Nahide Gökçora indicated that 1

December has been observed as the "World AIDS Day" since 1988, and drew attention to the importance of early diagnosis and treatment. Prof. Dr. Gökçora's statement reads as

"AIDS and HIV virus infection is deemed to be one of the world's most fatal epidemics. Collapse of the immune system within the 2-15 year period after HIV virus contamination leading to opportunistic infections and types of cancer is defined as AIDS. The virus that to this day has led to the demise of 34 million people is estimated to be carried by 36,7 million people today. 21 million of these people are currently receiving AIDS treatment. Last year more than a million pregnant HIV carriers received treatment in order to protect

As with many types of cancer and infections, early diagnosis can be a life saver. The life expectancy of HIV carriers in developed countries has been pulled up to the life expectancy of healthy individuals when there is early diagnosis. It must be stressed

that protective measures for the disease that is especially sexually transmitted should be highlighted. The symptoms must be well-known in order to be able to carry out early diagnosis. In the first few weeks after infection, symptoms such as temperature, headaches, eruption, sore throat or other flue like symptoms could exist. As the immune system weakens enlarged in later periods adenoids, weight loss, diarrhea and non-improving coughs appear. Educational institutions and the press must play a part in enlightening citizens by raising awareness on current research findings and publications.

Our Faculty plays its part in the fight against AIDS with the education it provides as well as its social awareness campaigns that stress the importance of early diagnosis."

"Cultural Heritage Conservation: **Sustainability and Environmental Impact**" **Seminar Takes Place at EMU**

Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) Eastern Mediterranean Cultural Heritage Research Center (DAKMAR) hosted the "Cultural Heritage Conservation: Sustainability and Environmental Impact" seminar. Speaking at the seminar which took place at 10:30 a.m. on Monday, the 27th of November 2017 at the Arts and Sciences Faculty room ASA 01, DAKMAR Chair Asst. Prof. Dr. Bülent Kızılduman thanked everyone for their participation wishing them a fruitful seminar.

The seminar was delivered by Rand Eppich, who is a Technalia Research Institute expert on architecture. The Technalia Research Institute has designed many projects including the Othello Castle for UNDP and the bi-communal Cultural Heritage Technical Committee. The seminar discussed the protection of cultural heritage in terms of socio-economic developments and tourism.

Eppich, who is an expert on the protection of historical

buildings, described himself as an environmentally-conscious person, indicating that the protection and reutilization of historical buildings is an important service to sustainability.

At the seminar which took place with the initiative of EMU-DAKMAR Board Member and EMU Architecture Faculty, Department of Interior Architecture academic staff member Assoc. Prof. Dr. Özlem Olgaç Türker, organization of DAKMAR members and research assistants and support of EMU Rector's Office, Eppich spoke about sustainable development as well as old and contemporary definitions of development. Touching upon the emergence of the concept of sustainability, Eppich stated that culture is considered the fourth component of sustainability in addition to the most commonly known components of economic, environmental and social dimension.

Touching upon how protecting and adapting historical buildings



contribute to the concept of sustainability Eppich highlighted that using existing buildings instead of constructing new ones prevents the consumption of resources and decreases waste from the demolition of buildings therefore making a positive environmental impact as well as contributing to cultural sustainability. Relaying institutions that support the protection of cultural heritage Eppich also touched upon the negative and positive aspects of tourism. Showing global examples of modern protection and renovation Eppich, also touched upon the use of recycled material. After a question and answer session at the end of the presentation, Eppich was handed a plaque of appreciation by DAKMAR representatives.

EMU Dr. Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty Marks International Day of Persons With Disabilities







Eastern Mediterranean University released a statement on the occasion of 3 December International Day of Persons with Disabilities. On behalf of the Faculty, academic staff member, Pediatric Health and Diseases Expert Dr. Umut Altunç provided information on the problems encountered by persons with disabilities and relevant work on overcoming problems

as such. Dr. Altunç's statement reads as follows:

The term disabled is used for persons who encounter physical, mental and structural limitations in performing their daily activities! Covering a wide spectrum, the term includes individuals at all ages including spastic children, children with

mental disabilities, learning disabilities, hearing or visual impairment, persons with autism or innate genetic disabilities, and so forth

A Billion Disabled Persons on Earth!

According to the 2017 report of the World Health Organisation, currently there are around 1 billion disabled persons worldwide. Most of these people live in poor or less developed countries where proper health services are not available. With the increasing incidences of traffic accidents, chronic and epidemic diseases, insufficient pre and post natal health services, population increase, terrorism and violence, the number of disabled persons will undoubtedly increase day by day!

Being a Disabled Person in the TRNC!

According to the World Health
Organisation, one in every 7 persons have
some sort of disability. However, data
on the number of disabled persons, their
proper diagnosis and possible causes for
their disability is not available in Northern
Cyprus. Disabled persons encounter many
problems in different dimensions of life.
Unfortunately, social possibilities and
facilities essential for disabled persons are
far below the European standards in our
country.

Developed Countries Overcome

In developed regions like Europe and the USA, serious efforts have been put towards the treatment and rehabilitation of the disabled. For the proper integration of disabled individuals into the society, opportunities for free and special education are provided. For example, if you are a parent of an autistic child residing in the United Kingdom, Social Aid Organisations visit you at home and guide you towards a special education institution according to your child's disability and needs. In places where the state facilities are not available, private social aid organisations provide special services.

In countries as such, in line with the relevant laws and standards, all means are regulated in such a way that they serve towards the welfare of the disabled.

Academic and Social Projects of Dr Fazıl Küçük Medicine Faculty

Having conducted extensive research on "Autism" as one of the most frequently encountered developmental disorders at the childhood stage, our faculty has reached the findings demonstrating the environmental reasons for autism in the TRNC. This year, we are conducting research on "Newborn Infections" causing disabilities at birth. We will soon share our research findings with public and submit a report to the Ministry of Health regarding the recommended measures in avoiding such unwanted situations.

Our university and faculty provide services in a disability friendly environment. As the only medicine faculty operating under a state university in the TRNC, we will work hard towards increasing the social achievements of the disabled individuals, and contributing to the state health policies regarding the early diagnosis, advanced examination and special education possibilities of and for the disabled.

We should all be aware that contributing to the welfare of the disabled individuals in our environment is our collective responsibility.
